The role of UIS in monitoring SDGs

UIS ...will continue to produce international monitoring indicators based on its annual education survey and on other data sources that guarantee international comparability...in addition to collecting data, the UIS will work with partners to develop new indicators, statistical approaches and monitoring tools to better assess progress across the targets...

What does Education 2030 and the SDGs imply for indicators and data sources?

□ Global (SDGs)

 4 of 11 indicators could be based on household surveys

Thematic (Education 2030) 18 of 43 indicators could be based on household surveys, including 4 global indicators

How does UIS ensure international comparability of education statistics?

- > Adopting ISCED (ISCED 2011)
- Using United National Population Division (UNPD) population estimates
- > Using World Bank and IMF economic data

UIS international education surveys

- UIS/OECD/EUROSTAT WEI (UOE-WEI) survey
 - > 64 high and middle income countries
 - > Data processing split between organizations
 - **UIS Education survey**
 - > 144 countries (most from developing world)
 - Data processed by UIS

UIS Education Survey of Formal Education (2016)

6 questionnaires – part of annual survey:

- Questionnaire A (UIS/ED/A): Students and Teachers (ISCED 0 - 4)
- Questionnaire B (UIS/ED/B): Educational Expenditure (ISCED 0-8)
- Questionnaire C (UIS/ED/C): Students and Teachers (ISCED 5 – 8)
- Regional Module for Africa (UIS/ED/AF)
- New! Questionnaire T (UIS/ED/T): Supplementary Questionnaire on Teachers
- > Questionnaire on national education system (UIS/ED/ISC11)

Key data gaps and issues

- Pre-primary education; missing or aggregated with Early Childhood Education Development (ECED)
- Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET); missing or aggregated with general programmes
- Post secondary non-tertiary education; missing
- Teaching staff disaggregated by ISCED level
- Data by age on all levels of education

- Expenditure allocated by ISCED levels.
- Expenditure by nature of spending.
