

#### **SDG Monitoring and Trends**

This country profile presents the data available to monitor SDG 4 global indicators. Data points for Sierra Leone are available for indicators 1.a, 4.1, 4.2, Education 2030 FFA, 4.b, 4.c, 4.3, and 4.a. The trends are calculated here as the difference between the mean annual growth rate before and after 2015, whenever at least three data points are available in each period. An up green arrow o, indicates that there was a positive change from the first period to the second. A down red arrow o indicates if the change was negative. Differences of +/-5% between the two periods are considered stable and marked with a right orange arrow o. For out-of-school rates, a squared red arrow o points down when the situation is worsening (when rates go up) and a green squared arrow o points up when the situation is improving (when rates go down). The gray area and line in the miniplot show the average for Sub-Saharan Africa (SDG) in the period.
